Objective	This course aims at giving to students a basic knowledge of the main authors of the esthetical theory and of the different conceptions within the sociology of art field.						
	The student goes through the whole history of art. From realism to modern avant-gardes, (S)he is introduced to the particularities of the content and the form of art works according to the sociological context of their emergence.						
	The overall objective is to embrace the plural dimension of art in its definition (painting, video, literature, architecture). Through these various fields of application, the student should understand how to use the conceptual and practical instruments of sociology of art (semiotics, Bourdieu field theory, public sociology, creation sociology, cultural studies).						
Content	From its creation to its reception, Art, taken in a broad sense, possesses an undeniable social reach. Through numerous examples, of movements and objects, of uses and functions, it mainly consists, for us, of understanding how the imaginary takes roots in the collective existence. Thus, we will discuss the links between the cultural field and the social field, by mobilizing various artistic domains (the modernity of avant-gardes, the image in the cultural studies, space and architecture, literature, poetry and painting).
